

ORDINANCE NO.2207-07

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CITY OF LAFOLLETTE
PERSONEL POLICY AS SET FORTH IN ORDINANCE NO. 2001-06

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMAN OF THE CITY OF LAFOLLETTE, TENNESSEE, as follows:

Whereas the City of LaFollette desires to include a provision in its personel policy regarding fraud, waste and/or abuse. Therefore, Section VI-Miscellaneous Policies, shall be amended by adding the following section:

R. Use of Municipal time, facilities, etc.

(1). An official or employee may not use or authorize the use of municipal time, facilities, equipment, fuel or supplies for private gain or advantage to himself/herself.

(2). An official or employee may not use or authorize the use of municipal time, facilities, equipment, fuel or supplies for private gain or advantage to any private person or entity, except as authorized by legitimate contract or lease that is determined by the city council to be in the best interests of the city.

(3) An official or employee may report any suspected violations of the City ethics policy to the Tennessee Comptroller of the Treasury at 1-800-232-5454 or online at <https://comptroller.tn.gov>.

A. **Conflict with Other Ordinances.** In case of conflict between this ordinance or any part thereof, and the whole or part of any existing or future ordinance of the City of LaFollette, the most restrictive shall in all cases apply.

B. **Validity.** If any section, clause, provision, or portion of this Ordinance shall be held to be in doubt or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not affect any other section, clause, provision, or portion of this Ordinance which is not of itself invalid or unconstitutional.

C. **Remaining Sections.** This amendment only applies to the above definition of said policy and all remaining terms and sections not specifically amended herein shall remain in full force and effect.

D. **Effective Date.** This ordinance shall become effective upon passage and publication, the public welfare requiring it.
