Access to nutritious food can significantly impact an individual's overall health and well-being. Campbell County estimates that 20.3% of residents meet the USDA's definition of food insecurity. Peanut butter is high in nutritional value and has a long shelf life, making it a much-needed item for food banks.

That's why we are joining other CHS-affiliated hospitals for the fourth annual Jars of Love Peanut Butter Drive this month. Across CHS-affiliated entities over the past four years we have collected enough peanut butter to make more than 4.4 million sandwiches. Our collective goal this year is to collect 100,000 more jars of peanut butter or other nut butters.

We will be collecting jars of peanut butter or other nut butters for **Open Arms Ministry & Food Life Services** from March 2 through March 30, and ask for you to help us in our efforts to surpass our goal of 1,500 jars.
